Transition Team Update

On Wednesday, 8/9, the Transition Team met for the second time. Again, the Transition Team is a team made up of parishioners from all the parishes involved in the proposed merger. Its purpose is to advise the pastor in uniting the parish communities and to help keep parishioners informed as to what is happening. Our team consists of 12 members, 3 representatives from each of the 4 parishes in our merger. Below is a list of the members:

In our meeting on Wednesday, 8/9, we first discussed the state of the parish merger. As many are aware an appeal to Rome has been made on behalf of St. Matthew, the Apostle Church. There is also potential for appeal from the St. Augustine and St. Elizabeth, Mother of John the Baptist parishes. The Archdiocese of St. Louis will be able to confirm whether an appeal has been made by those parishes by the end of September. This means that the parish merger is on-hold till a decision is finalized by the authorities in Rome. We will continue to worship together as one and provide sacramental and pastoral needs, but the individual parishes will remain as separate entities for the time being.

In order to respect the appeal process and after consulting the Transition Team, I've decided that the procedure of "naming the new parish" will be partially on-hold. We will begin receiving suggestions as to a "new name" but will not proceed past this "introductory stage" of the naming process. So, if you have thoughts as to a new name, let your Transition Team or me know, and we'll begin compiling a list.

In other business, we discussed how we received several sign-ups for liturgical ministers, but we are in need of more! I informed the Transition Team that we will have trainings for the various ministries in the near future: Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Servers/Acolytes, Lectors, Ushers, etc. Please sign-up! We are blessed to have two Kenrick-Glennon seminarians assist us this academic year. They will be joining us at our Sunday liturgies and helping out with various ministries after the Labor Day weekend.

Feedback from our first weekend of worshipping together as a parish family was overall very positive. There was, however, a request for a more even distribution of Saturday Vigil and Sunday Masses. In order to accommodate this request, we are going to make a slight change to our September Mass schedule so Our Lady of the Holy Cross, St. Augustine, and St. Matthew all have 1 month of Saturday Vigil Masses and 1 month of Sunday Masses moving forward. Because St. Elizabeth, Mother of John the Baptist is still in disrepair, it will remain limited to a Monday, All-School daily Mass. The new weekend Mass schedule for September and October will be as follows:

September: 4:00 pm Saturday Vigil at St. Matthew; 10:00 am Sunday at St. Augustine October: 4:00 pm Saturday Vigil at St. Augustine; 10:00 am Sunday at Our Lady of the Holy Cross

If you have feedback, questions, or comments regarding our weekend Masses, please inform the Transition Team or me. We want to keep alive the Spirit, Who is so palpably present!

Finally, if you have parish events you'd like published in our bulletin, bring them forward to the Transition Team. We will be providing space in our bulletin each week for upcoming events in our four parishes. These are great ways we can come together and unite as a family!

Any child or youth in the second grade or older who has been baptized: There will be a **mandatory orientation meeting** for parents (only) of children preparing to receive First Holy Communion (Eucharist) this year.

† Confirmation:

Any youth who has been baptized and must be in grades 7th - 12th and at least 12 years of age at the time of the administration of the Sacrament. All candidates and their families must attend an information session prior to enrollment.

† All other sacramental needs: Contact the parish office.

<u>Sacramental Preparation</u>: If you or anyone you know is in need of **any** sacrament, please contact the parish office immediately. It will soon be too late to enroll in many of these sessions this school year.
