Pastor's Pen

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! I hope these words find you well in the Lord!

Today in our Gospel, we begin hearing from Matthew "Chapter 18." This particular chapter is of great significance because it marks Jesus' famous discourse on the Kingdom, that is, His Church. In these words, Jesus clarifies the kind of kingdom he is establishing and how members of this community ought to conduct themselves. What exalted words of which to ponder and pray! I encourage you to take some time this week to slowly and reflectively read through this chapter. What captures your attention? How might the Lord be calling you to apply His teaching in your life?

As mentioned last week, today we have the honor to welcome the Knights and Ladies of St. Peter Claver as we celebrate his feast day! St. Peter Claver was a native of Catalonia, Spain. Shortly after he joined the Jesuits in 1601, he was sent on mission to the New World, specifically Cartagena, which is present day Columbia in South America. At the time, Cartagena was the chief slave market of South America. Ten thousand African slaves arrived in the port every month. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, St. Peter Claver began to minister to these men and women, who suffered horrifically at the hands of their slave traders. In thirty-three years, it is said, St. Peter Claver instructed and baptized over three hundred thousand slaves! What an extraordinary witness for us all!

As many of you know, **St. Peter Claver has a special tie to the City of St. Louis**, for it was in St. Louis at the Shrine of St. Joseph where his final miracle making him a saint occurred in 1864. Happy feast day to all, especially, to our Knights and Ladies under his patronage! St. Peter Claver, pray for us!

My prayers remain for you all... Please pray for me too! God bless and keep you always!

Any child or youth in the second grade or older who has been baptized: There will be a **mandatory orientation meeting** for parents (only) of children preparing to receive First Holy Communion (Eucharist) this year.

† Confirmation:

Any youth who has been baptized and must be in grades 7th - 12th and at least 12 years of age at the time of the administration of the Sacrament. All candidates and their families must attend an information session prior to enrollment.

† All other sacramental needs: Contact the parish office.

<u>Sacramental Preparation</u>: If you or anyone you know is in need of **any** sacrament, please contact the parish office immediately. It will soon be too late to enroll in many of these sessions this school year.
