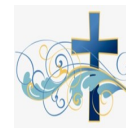

Pastor's Pen

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! I hope these words find you well in the Lord!

This weekend in our Gospel we hear the **“Parable of the Talents,”** and we are reminded of our responsibility to be faithful stewards of the gifts entrusted to us by our Heavenly Father. Almost every time I hear this parable, **my attention is drawn to the disposition of the unfaithful servant,** who received his talent and “went off and dug a hole in the ground and buried his master’s money” (Matthew 25:18). **Notice his perspective on the master:** “Master, I knew you were a demanding person, harvesting where you did not plant and gathering where you did not scatter” (25:23). Also, **see how the servant acts according to this perspective:** “...out of fear I went off and buried your talent in the ground” (25:23).

I once heard a priest say, **“Everyone has their own image of God... If it is false, it will govern us like a tyrant.”** How true that is! I remember hearing that statement, and I recall how it prompted me to reflect on some of the false images of God that I have adopted through the years. This is an important and necessary work on our part to acknowledge these erroneous notions of God and then replace them with a more faith-informed perspective on our Lord. This is an ongoing effort in our relationship with God, but the more we are diligent in this practice, the more we will step into the truth of Who God is in Himself, “...a God, gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in love and fidelity” (Exodus 34:6).

Next week marks the final week in Ordinary Time and the Solemnity of Christ the King. **We are very blessed to have Bishop Mark Rivotuso come to our St. Matthew, the Apostle, location and celebrate our principal Mass at 10:00 a.m.!** We hope you can join us for this glorious feast as we close out the liturgical year!

God bless and keep you all! My daily prayers remain for you and your loved ones!

“Transition Team Update”

On Wednesday, November 8th, the Transition Team met at the Our Lady of the Holy Cross location. **The Transition Team and I now meet on a monthly basis.** In the first three months of our parish merger, we met bi-monthly due to the newness of the merger and the pressing needs. Now, as we are a bit more settled, a monthly meeting seems more appropriate.

Recently, as many are aware, the Archdiocese of St. Louis gave us an update regarding the status of our parish merger. We learned that an appeal on behalf of St. Elizabeth, Mother of John the Baptist (SEMJB), is currently under review by the Dicastery for the Clergy in Rome. Also, we learned that an appeal on behalf of St. Matthew, the Apostle (SMA), was reviewed and rejected by the same office in Rome. There might be further appeals on behalf of SMA, but we will not know for sure until the aforementioned office in Rome notifies us. In an effort to keep the parishioners “up-to-date” with the latest information, we sent out a phone tree blast to our registered parishioners. We realize that not everyone received a call, so the Transition Team and I agreed this would be a great opportunity to make sure our parish has the correct contact information for our parishioners. Last week at the 10:00 a.m. Mass, we had **contact information sheets** for people to fill out, and in the coming weeks, we will also have them available. Please take the time to fill out a sheet so we can keep you in “the loop” with the latest parish news as it becomes available.

With the holiday season on the horizon, the Transition Team further discussed how the parish plans to celebrate Thanksgiving and the Advent and Christmas seasons and honor the traditions in place at our four parishes. For Thanksgiving, the Our Lady of the Holy Cross location will host a community dinner from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on Thanksgiving Day. This will be preceded by a community Mass at 9:00 a.m. Also, the Knights and Ladies of St. Peter Claver will host their annual Thanksgiving feast at St. Alphonsus “Rock” Church on November 25th from 12:00 to 4:00 p.m. Plans were also discussed regarding a “Breakfast with Santa” as we approach Christmas. **We strongly desire to keep alive the many traditions and charitable giving opportunities** related to the holiday season, so please bring forward to the Transition Team (Transition Team members are listed on the front of the bulletin) or to me your ideas for implementation.

As many of you know, the Advent season is a great time to celebrate the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**. The Transition Team and I discussed ways in which we can host a communal penance service for the people of our parish. It seemed that the most ideal time for a penance service would be a Saturday morning or afternoon. I hope to have more information on this effort in the coming weeks. Your thoughts and feedback are greatly appreciated, so please don’t hesitate to contact a Transition Team member or myself regarding your input.

In other news, **you might have noticed on our livestream feed that we are beginning to run advertisements for parish and communal events.** Thank you to our Communications and Media team for making this possible! This is another means of getting the word out regarding important news and events affecting our community. As mentioned previously, we value open communication, and we are happy to report that we are making headway in this regard. Once again, if you have any ideas or feedback, it is greatly welcome and appreciated.
